As Maine Went looks behind the headlines at the results of LePage's hard-right policies on everything from health care to the economy and the environment. This book is a case study of what happens when the Tea Party, a movement defined by its distrust of government, is handed the keys to a state. Author Mike Tipping is a columnist and blogger for the Portland Press Herald and Bangor Daily News whose writing has brought to light a series of controversial statements and actions by Governor LePage. Mike revealed the governor's false claim that 47 of Mainers refuse to work, his theory that a wind turbine was fraudulently driven by a little electric motor, his exemption of his own state pension from his budget cutbacks, and, most recently, the wholesale plagiarism of the Alexander Report, among many other examples.
